Our goal – our benefit


- Detailed psychoeducation reduces shame, gives hope and insight: "Mental disorders are real disorders that can be cured and have nothing to do with weakness"




SPAZ - Patient frequency 2020 - 2024








SPAZ - FREQUENZEN






PATIENT FREQUENCY - by Month - 2020 - 2024



- Integration of coping strategies
