Mental health in figures

- ✤ 1 in 6 people suffered from mental health issues before the COVID-19 pandemic
- Suicide is the second leading cause of death among young people aged 15-19
- Annual value of lost mental health in children and young people is estimated at €50 billion

A comprehensive approach to mental health

Guiding principles

- 1. Access to adequate and effective prevention
- 2. Access to high quality and affordable mental healthcare and treatment
- 3. Reintegration into society after recovery



The comprehensive approach:

- Address key policy sectors beyond the public health sector
- Aims to put tools in place to drive change
- Supports Member States in their efforts to achieve the WHO targets for NCDs by 2025 and SDG by 2030





Joint Actions

✓ JA ImpleMENTAL (EUR 5.4 million)

Transferring best practices on mental health systems reforms and suicide prevention.

✓ Joint action MENTOR (EUR 6 million)

Support the implementation of the Mental Health Communication.

✓ Joint action under EU4Health 2024 work programme (EUR 6 million)

Future joint action that will address the mental health of vulnerable groups





The need for synergies

It is important the need for synergies with relevant projects and initiatives:

- to ensure to build on existing projects and their outcomes and lessons learnt.
- to cooperate and exchange information on regular basis.

This will ensure the best use of resources, avoids overlaps and projects can benefit from each other.

HaDEA will facilitate this.





EU Best Practice Portal

- Last year a call on best and promising practices was launched.
- 29 initiatives were identified as either "best" or "promising" using Member States agreed criteria.
- They have been included in the EU Repository dedicated to mental health in the EU Best Practice Portal.
- This Portal is designed to help find reliable and practical information on implemented best and promising in the area of public health.
- These practices are publicly available and for everyone to benefit from.
